Science Education to Enhance Development



As 2020 comes to a close, we reflect on the difficulties this year has brought to the people of Kanungu and look forward to a brighter future.

Great Lakes Regional University (GLRU) was forced to close its doors in March because of the coronavirus. The government of Uganda imposed a total travel ban which led to great economic hardship throughout the country. With the loss of jobs, hunger became a problem and SEED assisted in providing food support to faculty and staff on unpaid furlough. The graduating class was allowed to return in October to complete their studies but there was no incoming freshman class and consequently a huge decrease in the fees which are necessary to support the university.

The university shutdown provided an opportunity for the administrative team to develop new and more transparent financial policies and to engage in a strategic planning process to guide its mission for the next 5 years. We are grateful for the very able leadership of Honest Wilkins as University Secretary and head of CHIFCOD (the community development group of which GLRU is a part) and Dorothy Kabugo, the Acting Vice Chancellor.

As for SEED, the team has taken the opportunity to carry out necessary repairs and renovations to the building, installing new lab benches with sinks and gas supply. Windows and sills have also been upgraded to minimize water damage. The whole building has received a new coat of paint (see below).







Another positive development this year has been significant upgrades to the local health centre, including a new maternity wing. Uganda Development Initiative (our parent organization) and International Rotary played significant roles in the these improvements.



As we enter 2021, SEED hopes to provide access to a new and larger class of future science teachers by providing financial assistance through the Future Teachers Fund and upgrading facilities thought the General Fund.

Great Lakes Regional University, located in Kanungu in southwest Uganda, draws its students from a remote rural area of subsistence farmers. The goal of the SEED Institute, within the University, is to train much-needed high school science teachers for the region and to improve access to all qualified students on the basis of need and merit through scholarships and loans.
